MASS FOR THIS WEEKEND-Bishop Deshotel is urging everyone to wear masks while attending Weekend and Weekday Masses. *Phase 2-50% occupancy for our church requires a limit of **150** persons at each mass. The Church doors will be opened 30 minutes before mass. Maintain 6 feet safe distancing at all times. There will not be any missalettes in pews. You may bring your copy of Magnificat or Word Among Us but please take home after mass. The Gifts will not be brought up. For Communion Time- Use hand sanitizer before you receive communion, please bring your own or use bottle in back of church. One row at a time-Parishioners go out one by one with 6 feet distance in between. *Receive Communion in the hands. After mass, please take a bulletin from Usher and exit building with 6 feet distancing.

*Parishioners are not to socialize in church. You may visit outside after Mass away from exits and should be encouraged to physically distance and to wear masks.

If you are sick, please attend only when you are well. Also, persons over 65 years old are at a higher risk of experiencing worse symptoms than others if they contact the coronavirus and should consider not attending Mass.

*Phase 2 also-All Catholics in the Diocese of Lafayette remain dispensed from their obligation from attending Sunday Masses until we get word from Bishop Deshotel. The duty to sanctify Sunday should be fulfilled through some other form of devotion, watch mass on television or on the internet, pray the rosary, scripture reading, etc. ***Confessions will be heard in Sacristy Room behind Altar from 30 minutes before mass to 10 minutes before mass starts. Go to the Mary Alcove and wait 6 feet apart from others to enter one at a time. If no one is there in line, check to see in Sacristy if anyone is in there with Father.**

“The Eucharist is the bread that gives strength...It is at once the most eloquent proof of His love and the most powerful means of fostering His love in us. He gives Himself every day so that our hearts as burning coals may set afire the hearts of the faithful.” *St. Damien of Molokai*

Reflection on the Gospel-Simon Barjonah confesses Jesus as the Christ and recognizes him for who he is. Jesus responds by saying this insight was given to him by the Heavenly Father. Jesus then names him “Peter,” a Greek term meaning “Rock” (in Aramaic the term is Kephias). Jesus then says that on this “rock,” he will build his “church.” The term “church” appears in the gospels only in Matthew, and only here and in Matthew 18:17. Matthew is reminding his audience that Peter was a spokesperson for the group and confessed Jesus as Christ. Yet even this confession was not due to his own insight but was a gift of the Father.
