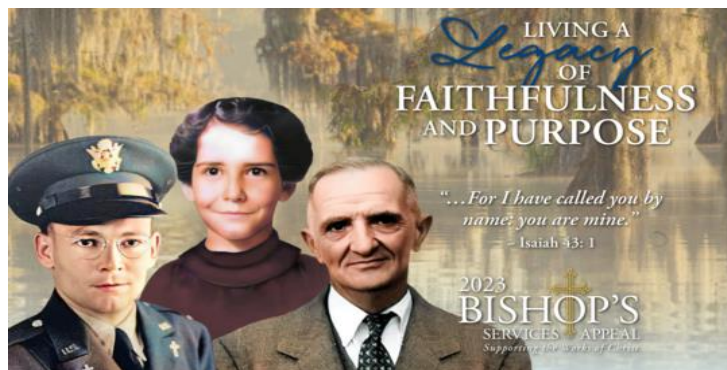
**9TH ANNUAL FETE-DIEU du TECHE SOUTH-Tuesday,
